



Mandates

The First Nations Technology Council has been mandated by the First Nations Summit, BC Assembly of First Nations and the Union of BC Indian Chiefs to address the technology related needs of BC's First Nations communities. Between 2002 and 2007 the following resolutions were passed that created the organization and set direction and priorities:

First Nation Summit Resolution #0602.12

Establishment of a First Nations Technology Council

"The First Nations Technology Council's mandate is to develop a First Nations Technology plan for First Nations in British Columbia which will address technology issues, including:

- a) high speed internet connection
- b) technology skills development
- c) development of technical support

"That the FNTC seek support from the federal and provincial governments to develop the First Nations Technology Plan"

Expansion of the mandate of the First Nations Technology Council

To include the use of technology as a tool to support the revitalization of culture and language in all First Nations communities in BC

Recognition of telecommunication and supporting technology as basic community capital infrastructure.
